Inductive Bible Study Steps & Tools

STEP 1: Pray

STEP 2: Observe

What does the passage say?

- □ Read the chapter or Scripture portion. Write down anything that stands out to you.
- Mark Key Words: This will help you catch all the details (TIP: Use different colors for each.) As you re-read the chapter mark:
 - References to God, Jesus, Holy Spirit.
 - Key words. These are meaningful words that may repeat and express a theme or topic.
 - Five "W"s and an "H": Mark Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How using a different color for each. You can also write out the main answers to each question as an overview.
- Make Lists: List every fact given about a key word or person with the Scripture reference for future use. Use only words from the text.
- Word Studies: Go deeper with key words and other important words by looking up their meanings in the original Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic. Use a Strong's Concordance book or access Strong's at www.blueletterbible.org:
 - Type in the Scripture and translation
 - Press the "Tool" button
 - Select the "Interlinear" tab
 - Select "Strong's" number reference

STEP 3: Interpret

What does the passage mean?

Cross Reference: Use a cross-reference Bible, or BlueLetterBible.org "Tools", to look at similar Scriptures to help understand the context and meaning. Write down what you find.

STEP 4: Apply

What does the passage mean to you personally?

Write down your thoughts. What did you learn? What should you change in your life?
 Mark your personal application thoughts with "PA" in your Bible.



4. What sufferings did Paul endure in this chapter? As Christians, how can we endure suffering?

2 Timothy Ch. 2 Study Questions

1. In verses 3-7 describe the attributes of the good soldier, the athlete, and the farmer. Which one can you most relate to regarding your walk with Christ?

2. How and why did Jesus Christ and Paul endure suffering for us in verses 8-13? What do we have to gain or lose when we endure suffering for the sake of the Gospel?

3. Read verses 19 and 20. Do you consider yourself a vessel of gold and silver, or wood and clay in God's house? In what way(s) are you challenged to purify yourself to be a more useful vessel?

4. Make a list of the many instructions Paul gives to Timothy in this chapter (Hint: look for the verbs). Which one(s) speak to you personally in your life today?

3. What is the key to godliness according to verse 16? What steps can you take to be better equipped for every good work?

4. What specific thing does Paul write to Timothy that stands out to you the most in this chapter?

3. What did Paul do to ensure his future and his rewards in heaven (verses 6-8). What would you say is your ministry presently? How are you fulfilling it?

4. This is the last letter Paul wrote before his death. What would you say to your loved ones if you knew your days were coming to an end?
