## **Inductive Bible Study Steps & Tools**

### STEP 1: Pray

### STEP 2: Observe

## What does the passage say?

- □ Read the chapter or Scripture portion. Write down anything that stands out to you.
- Mark Key Words: This will help you catch all the details (TIP: Use different colors for each.) As you re-read the chapter mark:
  - References to God, Jesus, Holy Spirit.
  - Key words. These are meaningful words that may repeat and express a theme or topic.
  - Five "W"s and an "H": Mark Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How using a different color for each. You can also write out the main answers to each question as an overview.
- Make Lists: List every fact given about a key word or person with the Scripture reference for future use. Use only words from the text.
- □ <sup>★</sup> Word Studies: Go deeper with key words and other important words by looking up their meanings in the original Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic. Use a Strong's Concordance book or access Strong's at www.blueletterbible.org:
  - Type in the Scripture and translation
  - Press the "Tool" button
  - Select the "Interlinear" tab
  - Select "Strong's" number reference

## STEP 3: Interpret

## What does the passage mean?

□ <sup>★</sup> Cross Reference: Use a cross-reference Bible, or BlueLetterBible.org "Tools", to look at similar Scriptures to help understand the context and meaning. Write down what you find.

## STEP 4: Apply

## What does the passage mean to you personally?

Write down your thoughts. What did you learn? What should you change in your life?
Mark your personal application thoughts with "PA" in your Bible.



4. Sum up in your own words what Paul is saying in verses 24-29.

2. In verses 12-25 Paul talks about conducting ourselves in a variety of relationships. If Jesus were to give you a performance evaluation on your current relationships, what do you think His evaluation would be and what changes should you make?

3. What are key verses that stood out to you in this chapter and why?

Notice how Paul doesn't ask to be released from his imprisonment, but to be used in it (vs. 3 & 4). How does this challenge and encourage you in your own life difficulties?
