Inductive Bible Study Steps & Tools

STEP 1: Pray

STEP 2: Observe

What does the passage say?

- Read the chapter or Scripture portion. Write down anything that stands out to you.
- ✂ Mark Key Words: This will help you catch all the details (TIP: Use different colors for each.) As you re-read the chapter mark:
 - References to God, Jesus, Holy Spirit.
 - Key words. These are meaningful words that may repeat and express a theme or topic.
 - Five “W”s and an “H”: Mark Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How using a different color for each. You can also write out the main answers to each question as an overview.
- ✂ Make Lists: List every fact given about a key word or person with the Scripture reference for future use. Use only words from the text.
- ✂ Word Studies: Go deeper with key words and other important words by looking up their meanings in the original Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic. Use a Strong’s Concordance book or access Strong’s at www.blueletterbible.org:
 - Type in the Scripture and translation
 - Press the “Tool” button
 - Select the “Interlinear” tab
 - Select “Strong’s” number reference

STEP 3: Interpret

What does the passage mean?

- ✂ Cross Reference: Use a cross-reference Bible, or BlueLetterBible.org “Tools”, to look at similar Scriptures to help understand the context and meaning. Write down what you find.

STEP 4: Apply

What does the passage mean to you personally?

- Write down your thoughts. What did you learn? What should you change in your life? Mark your personal application thoughts with “PA” in your Bible.

Hebrews 3 Study Questions

1. What are some noteworthy similarities between Moses and Jesus? Why is this comparison important in this chapter?
2. Verses 12-13 bring a strong warning. What causes one to become hardened, and why is this dangerous? How do we ward off a harden heart according to verse 13?
3. What can we learn today from the Israelites choices so long ago? Where did they go wrong?

4. How is Jesus greater than any other priest? What holds you back from boldly goingn to Him?

1. Who is Melchizedek and what do you learn about the meaning of 'the order of Melchizedek'? (Read also Genesis 14:17-20.)
2. What is the writer of Hebrews establishing by bringing up Melchizedek and his order? How is Jesus in the likeness of the Melchizedek priesthood and not the Levitical priesthood?
3. In verses 18-28 how and why is the priesthood of Melchizedek/Jesus better than the Levitical?

Hebrews 8 Study Questions

1. Rewrite the author's main point from verses 1-2 in your own words.
2. Why was there a need for a better covenant according to verses 6-9?
3. The old, earthly priesthood and system is just a copy and shadow of the real, heavenly one (v 5). Make a list from verses 10-12 of the better and superior covenant that is yet to come.
4. Hebrews 8:8-12 quotes Jeremiah 31:31-34, which compares the new covenant with the old covenant. In what areas of your life are you hanging on to old, obsolete ways instead of following Christ as a new creation?

Hebrews 10 Study Questions

1. Why is the Mosaic law only a shadow of the good things to come?
2. What are the benefits of the new and better covenant through Jesus Christ?
3. Now that we have this better covenant what are we instructed to do (verses 19-25)? Which of these areas need strengthening in your own life?
4. Over time the Jewish Christians were weakening under life's pressures and persecutions. Likewise, over time we too can become weak in our faith. What warning is given in verses 26-31 to the Christians back then and now?
5. What encouragement is given in verses 32-39 to continue strong in the faith of Jesus Christ?

3. Becoming holy is a main topic of this chapter. What does this mean and what does it look like?

3. The benediction in verses 20 & 21 is a perfect way to conclude this book of Hebrews. What comfort and hope do they give you?
